Tonight (March 17) at 8 p.m., Temple of the Arts at the Wilshire Theatre will feature an evening of gospel music, worship and brotherhood in an intercultural service uniting both the Jewish and African American communities.

The event is the brainchild of Rabbi David Baron, founder of Temple of the Arts, which last year established its home at the

Wilshire Theatre.

Tonight's event will focus on the themes of freedom and faith as they celebrate both the Jewish and African American people's exodus from enslavement.

Says Rabbi Baron, "We relate to the plight of slaves or those unjustly imprisoned or exploited because we were once slaves in the land of Egypt."

Rabbi Baron, Bishop Charles E. Blake, award-winning photographer Ron Haviv who will narrate slides from his acclaimed "Children of Darfur" exhibit, and the 60-voice Revelation Gospel Choir of West Los Angeles Church.
