## **HILL OBSERVES HIGH HOLLYWOOD DAYS**

**WASHINGTON** - Before ramping up for Tinseltown fund-raisers this weekend, Sen. Hillary Clinton stuck to the serious yesterday by delivering a solemn Yom Kippur "living sermon" to a crowded Beverly Hills synagogue.

Clinton dedicated a memorial candle to the victims of Hurricane Katrina after addressing the congregation at the Temple of the Arts in Beverly Hills.

"A living sermon means instead of quoting them or their books, I can present them in person," Rabbi David Baron, who invited Clinton after being touched by her 2003 memoir "Living History," told the Jewish Journal.

Beginning today, Clinton will be praying for campaign cash as she schmoozes Hollywood heavyweights at fund-raisers hosted by La-La Land power brokers.

Director Rob Reiner is throwing a \$500-a-head bash tonight, followed tomorrow by a \$1,000-per-person brunch put on by producers Bruce Cohen and David Jinks.

Clinton has raised more than \$12 million for her re-election- and this second fund-raising trip to Los Angeles in four months is fueling speculation she's eyeing a 2008 White House run. *Ian Bishop*
